The In-service Certificate in English Language Teaching (ICELT) is a professional development course for teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages. It aims to develop the practice and underpinning knowledge and awareness of teachers in post and to improve their use of language for teaching purposes.

Course content

ICELT courses include two modules (Module One: Language for Teachers; Module Two: Teaching and Methodology). Courses are designed by individual centres using defined syllabus and course objectives. The following units of learning are covered:

- 1 Language knowledge and awareness
- 2 The background to teaching and learning English
- 3 Resources and materials
- 4 Planning and management of teaching and learning
- 5 Evaluation, monitoring and assessment
- 6 Professional development
- 7 Language for teachers

Assessment

There are three components of assessment:

Component One: Language for Teachers

Component Two: Teaching* Component Three: Methodology

Grades of Award

Candidates who have met the assessment criteria for each component receive a component grade (Pass/Merit/Distinction) and an overall grade (Pass/Merit/Distinction).

It is possible to enter candidates for Module One only. Candidates who successfully complete Module One will receive a Module One certificate. They can then be entered for Module Two, which must be completed within three years of completing Module One. Candidates who follow the modular route, where components are taken sequentially, are issued with an individual component grade which will be carried forward so that all component grades and a final overall grade appear on the final certificate. Criteria for the award of component grades are described in the ICELT Syllabus.

Any alteration to this certificate renders it invalid and use of an altered certificate could constitute a criminal offence.

If there is any doubt about the details recorded on the certificate, contact the local Cambridge Assessment English centre for advice on verification procedures.

^{*} Candidates may be assessed teaching classes at one or two different levels (e.g. elementary and/or intermediate). Learners may be from the same context or two different contexts (e.g. children in the primary sector and/or adults in a language school).
