Within this framework, each participant also completed 6 hours of individual teaching which was observed and assessed by an experienced trainer.

Aurélie has a lively, engaging manner, with good confidence and authority in the classroom. Aurélie came on the course with some teaching experience, including with young learners, and she made very good progress as she took on board ideas from input sessions and observations. She is a thorough planner, who can analyse language in depth, and she experimented with different lesson types on the course. Her lessons became more student-centred as the course progressed, and she improved her skills with the use of concept-checking questions. All CELTA assessment criteria were achieved, and some were well achieved. CELTA requirements for written work are met.

- Aurélie can plan effectively with some guidance. She can analyse target language well and select appropriate resources and tasks for successful language and language skills development.
- She can deliver effective language and skills lessons, using a variety of classroom teaching techniques successfully.
- She shows good awareness of learners and can respond so that learners benefit from the lessons.
- She can reflect on key strengths and weaknesses and can generally use these reflections to develop her teaching skills.

Her comments on her colleagues' teaching practice lessons were detailed and insightful. Her own self-evaluation was consistently perceptive and accurate. Aurélie comes across as a friendly and conscientious person, who is already a good language teacher and will be an asset to the staff in any language school.
