From September 2003, the University has been complying with the Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF) by adopting its terminology to describe the accumulation of credit leading to educational qualifications. The terminology consists of levels and credits.

SCQF credit definitions of undergraduate qualifications of higher education institutions are as follows:

Level Typical qualifications and their credit definitions

SCQF 10	Scottish Bachelors degree with Honours	Minimum 484 with minimum of 180 at SCQF 9 and SCQF 10 of which a minimum of 90 at SCQF 10
SCQF 9	Scottish Bachelors degree	Minimum 352 with minimum of 60 at SCQF 9
SCQF 8	Diploma in Higher Education	Minimum 242 with minimum of 90 at SCQF 8
SCQF 7	Certificate in Higher Education	Minimum 132 with minimum of 90 at SCQF 7

The following qualifications are typically for graduates or equivalent, but are not of postgraduate level of outcome:

Graduate Diploma	Minimum of 120 at SCQF 9 or above
Graduate Certificate	Minimum of 60 at SCQF 9 or above
University Certificate	Minimum of 44 at SCQF 7 or above

Other Information

- Any final year module which spans the Autumn and Spring semesters may be listed twice on the supplement. The final grade and credit value for the module is normally shown against the Autumn record.
- Some students may be granted entry credit and admitted with advanced standing. There are no grades associated with entry credit.
